*Oregon currently has 40 NAWCA projects either completed or underway. These projects have conserved a total of 113,202 acres of wildlife habitat. NAWCA funding of more than \$20.6 million stimulated partner contributions of over \$80.4 million. These figures do not include multi-state projects.*

## WILLAMETTE VALLEY PARTNERSHIP I

Situated between the Coast Range to the west and Cascade Mountains to the east, the Willamette Valley is a long, flat floodplain that historically supported over 600,000 acres of wetlands and now contains a high proportion of nationally and regionally decreasing wetland types. This project is phase one of an effort to create a waterfowl migration and wintering corridor in the valley. It will develop four waterfowl-centric wetland complexes, protecting 460 acres and restoring 490 acres of wetlands in Ankeny National Wildlife Refuge, three state Wildlife Management Areas, and adjacent privately owned lands.
